

Three graduate e-learners (Vincent Gasasira, Fanny Ipinge, and Dr. Olubukola M. Odeyemi) were selected by the Board of Directors in June 2023 to receive the PEF Postharvest Training Leadership Award. Each awardee received a postharvest resources/tools/training kit valued at US\$1500 and was invited to participate in a study tour in Kenya from 18-22 November 2024. As part of the PEF Leadership study tour, the team interacted with members of the PEF Board of Directors (Dr. Vijay Yadav and Dr. Diane Barrett), representatives from the African Centre of Technology Studies (ACTS), Techwin Ltd., Cold Solutions, Jungle Harvest, and Soko Fresh to discuss their work and explore possible future collaborations. The team also met some of our PEF E-learning graduates - Prof. Jane Ambuko from the University of Nairobi (UoN), Eng. Samuel and Eng. Florence from Jomo Kenyatta University of Agriculture and Technology (JKUAT) to learn more about their postharvest research activities.











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Green Jobs for Rural Youth - Decentralized Renewable Energy (DRE)



DRE technologies create new and increased employment opportunities in rural communities, particularly in agriculture, the largest employer in developing nations, with 50% to 85% of the labor force working in the sector. This publication addresses the data gaps in this sector for four countries (India, Kenya, Nigeria, and Uganda), and quantifies the jobs created by DRE technologies in agriculture. It also provides the first comprehensive estimate of employment levels and trends at the country level.

Postharvest Assessment for Horticulture Value Chain in Guinea-Bissau

The report presents the assessment to identify the suitable postharvest intervention(s) for Guinea-Bissau to reduce losses and enhance the income of smallholder farmers.


The key findings suggested higher viability of smaller cold rooms at market gates and small-scale passive evaporative coolers at the field level. It also highlighted the need for proper harvesting techniques - proper maturity indices, the right tools, gentle handling after harvest, and improved packaging and transport services.

Guidelines for FLW reduction - Near East and North Africa (NENA)



This document published by FAO provides a roadmap for NENA Member Countries to reduce food loss and waste (FLW), aligning with their national agricultural and food system goals. It offers a framework for developing strategies, policies, and laws to combat FLW. The actions and principles outlined aim to drive the region towards more sustainable and resilient food systems. The guidelines considered the diverse economic, social, and environmental conditions as well as varied nature and types of food loss and waste across different NENA countries.
